

- **Who:** Home Educated Students in the K–6th grades
- **What:** A studies program that offers many classes that run during the school year with 2 sessions (Fall and Spring) that consist of 28 weeks total.
- **When:** Tuesdays and Thursdays from 1–3:30p.m.
- **Where:** Akron Fossils and Science Center
- **Why:** To engage students in many areas of study.
- **Cost:** Varies per class. Books are a requirement and must be purchased separately.
- **Payment Plan:** After the initial \$100 deposit, payments can be made throughout the year in 7 monthly installments.

- **Cost:** \$290

Students will be introduced to the history of cultures around the world, beginning with ancient river valley civilizations through the Age of Exploration. From the pyramids of Ancient Egypt to the shining armor of knights during Middle Ages in Europe, this class will aim to excite a passion for better understanding of civilizations around the world creating a foundation to better understand how history has unfolded over time.

Using multiple curriculums, students will work in all traditional areas of study to develop a love for the art of language. Topics will include phonics, reading, parts of speech, rhyming, sentence structure, handwriting, punctuation, comprehension, capitalization, composition, public speaking, vocabulary, proofreading, spelling, grammar, reference skills, and word studies.

Foundations of Entrepreneurship

Students will learn what it means to be an entrepreneur and the basic steps to develop, launch and run a business. In the first semester, students will learn about the career of entrepreneurship, strategies for finding business opportunities, and the building blocks of a business. In the second semester, students will learn the basic pieces of a business plan and what it takes to run a business. Students will work as a class to develop a business idea and write a class business plan.
